
Leviticus is not just a list of rules; it is a divine revelation of God's holiness and His desire for His people to dwell in His presence.

Atonement for Uncleanness

Atonement

The means of reconciliation between God and man.


- Leviticus 11 deals with clean and unclean food.
- Leviticus 12 talks about uncleanness after childbirth.
- Leviticus 13 gives regulations about skin diseases and molds that could make someone or something unclean.
- Leviticus 14 gives directions for cleansing from uncleanness resulting from skin diseases and molds.
- Leviticus 15 deals with bodily discharges that make a person unclean.

The Tabernacle

A place where God's presence could dwell among his people.



The Tabernacle: God's Presence Among His People

EXODUS 25:8

Then have them make a sanctuary for me, and I will dwell among them.


The tabernacle was divided into three main sections:

- 1. The Outer Court Where sacrifices were made.
- 2. The Inner Court Also called the Holy Place, where the priests ministered.
- 3. The Holy of Holies The most sacred space, containing the Ark of the Covenant, where God's presence dwelt.


EXODUS 26:33—34


33 Hang the curtain from the clasps and place the ark of the covenant law behind the curtain. The curtain will separate the Holy Place from the Most Holy Place. 34 Put the atonement cover on the ark of the covenant law in the Most Holy Place.


LEVELS OF HOLINESS IN THE TABERNACLE

"an atonement cover"


HILASTĒRION

HEBREWS 9:5


5 Above the ark were the cherubim of the Glory, overshadowing the atonement cover (hilastērion). But we cannot discuss these things in detail now.

ROMANS 3:25-26

25 God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement (hilastērion), through the shedding of his blood—to be received by faith. He did this to demonstrate his righteousness, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished— 26 he did it to demonstrate his righteousness at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in

Jesus as the True Tabernacle

EXODUS 40:34

The cloud covered the tent of meeting, and the glory of the Lord filled the tabernacle."

Jesus as the High Priest

HEBREWS 9:11—12

11 But when Christ came as high priest of the good things that are now already here, he went through the greater and more perfect tabernacle that is not made with human hands, that is to say, is not a part of this creation. 12 He did not enter by means of the blood of goats and calves; but he entered the Most Holy Place once for all by his own blood, thus obtaining eternal redemption

Jesus as the Sacrifice

HEBREWS 10:5-7

- 5 Therefore, when Christ came into the world, he said: "Sacrifice and offering you did not desire, but a body you prepared for me;
- 6 with burnt offerings and sin offerings you were not pleased.
- 7 Then I said, 'Here I am—it is written about me in the scroll I have come to do your will, my God.'" will, we have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

HEBREWS 10:8-10

8 First he said, "Sacrifices and offerings, burnt offerings and sin offerings you did not desire, nor were you pleased with them"—though they were offered in accordance with the law. 9 Then he said, "Here I am, I have come to do your will." He sets aside the first to establish the second. 10 And by that will, we have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.
