The Establishment of the City of David

1 CHRONICLES 11:4-9

4 David and all the Israelites marched to Jerusalem (that is, Jebus). The Jebusites who lived there 5 said to David, “You will not get in here.”

Nevertheless, David captured the fortress of Zion—which is the City of David. 6 David had said, “Whoever leads the attack on the Jebusites will become commander in chief.” Joab son of Zeruiah went up first, and so he received the command.

1 CHRONICLES 11:4-9

7 David then took up residence in the fortress, and so it was called the City of David. 8 He built up the city around it, from the terraces to the surrounding wall, while Joab restored the rest of the city. 9 And David became more and more powerful, because the Lord Almighty was with him.

DEUTERONOMY 12:5

5 But you are to seek the place the Lord your God will choose from among all your tribes to put his Name there for his dwelling. To that place you must go;

God's Covenant with David

1 CHRONICLES 17:10-14

“I declare to you that the Lord will build a house for you: 11 When your days are over and you go to be with your ancestors, I will raise up your offspring to succeed you, one of your own sons, and I will establish his kingdom. 12 He is the one who will build a house for me, and I will establish his throne forever.

1 CHRONICLES 17:10-14

13 I will be his father, and he will be my son. I will never take my love away from him, as I took it away from your predecessor. 14 I will set him over my house and my kingdom forever; his throne will be established forever.”

JEREMIAH 33:17

For this is what the Lord says: 'David will never fail to have a man to sit on the throne of Israel,

LUKE 1:30-33

30 But the angel said to her, “Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. 31 You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. 32 He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, 33 and he will reign over Jacob’s descendants forever; his kingdom will never end.”

HEBREWS 1:3-5

3 The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. 4 So he became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is superior to theirs. 5 For to which of the angels did God ever say, "You are my Son; today I have become your Father"? Or again, "I will be his Father, and he will be my Son"?

GALATIANS 3:6-8

6 So also Abraham “believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness.

7 Understand, then, that those who have faith are children of Abraham. 8 Scripture foresaw that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, and announced the gospel in advance to Abraham: “All nations will be blessed through you.”

MATTHEW 28:18

18 Then Jesus came to them and said, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.

HEBREWS 12:22-24

22 But you have come to Mount Zion, to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem. You have come to thousands upon thousands of angels in joyful assembly, 23 to the church of the firstborn, whose names are written in heaven. You have come to God, the Judge of all, to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, 24 to Jesus the mediator of a new covenant,

The Establishment of David's Kingdom

1 CHRONICLES 11:1-3

All Israel came together to David at Hebron and said, “We are your own flesh and blood. 2 In the past, even while Saul was king, you were the one who led Israel on their military campaigns. And the Lord your God said to you, ‘You will shepherd my people Israel, and you will become their ruler.’” 3 When all the elders of Israel had come to King David at Hebron, he made a covenant with them at Hebron before the Lord, and they anointed David king over Israel, as the Lord had promised through Samuel.

COLOSSIANS 2:9-10

**For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form,
10 and in Christ you have been brought to fullness. He is the
head over every power and authority.**

1 CHRONICLES 11:10

10 These were the chiefs of David's mighty warriors—they, together with all Israel, gave his kingship strong support to extend it over the whole land, as the Lord had promised—

The Three:

1. JASHOBEAM

(also called Josheb-Basshebeth) – He was chief of the Three and is credited with killing 300 men with his spear in one battle (1 Chronicles 11:11; 2 Samuel 23:8).

The Three:

2. ELEAZAR SON OF DODO

He fought beside David when others fled and held his ground until his hand grew weary and froze to his sword (1 Chronicles 11:12–14; 2 Samuel 23:9–10).

The Three:

3. SHAMMAH SON OF AGEE

Though not named in 1 Chronicles, he is included in the Three according to 2 Samuel 23:11–12, where he defended a field of lentils and struck down the Philistines.

1 CHRONICLES 11:19

“God forbid that I should do this!” he said. “Should I drink the blood of these men who went at the risk of their lives?” Because they risked their lives to bring it back, David would not drink it.

with some.

MARK 14:32-34

32 They went to a place called Gethsemane, and Jesus said to his disciples, “Sit here while I pray.”

33 He took Peter, James and John along with him, and he began to be deeply distressed and troubled. 34 “My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death,” he said to them. “Stay here and keep watch.”

Be vulnerable
