EPHESIANS 1:4-5

4 For he chose us in him before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in his sight. In love
5 he predestined us for adoption to sonship through Jesus Christ, in accordance with his pleasure and will—

GALATIANS 4:4-5

4 But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, 5 to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship.

MARK 1:15

15 “The time has come,” he said. “The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!”

**Kalros—qualitative time; appointed season;
divinely chosen moment**

**Chronos—quantitative time; linear; minutes,
hours and days**

- Luke 1:5 — “In the time of Herod...”
- Luke 1:8-10 — Zechariah serving “when it was his turn,” at the time of incense.
- Luke 1:20 — “until the day this happens... at the appointed time.”
- Luke 1:23-24 — “When his time of service was completed... after this...”
- Luke 1:39-45 — “At that time Mary got ready and hurried...”
- Luke 2:1-7 — Caesar Augustus, Quirinius, and “while they were there, the time came...”
- Luke 2:21-24 — “On the eighth day...” and “when the time came for purification...”
- Luke 2:25-32 — Simeon waiting his whole life—time as longing.
- Luke 2:41-52 — Jesus at twelve years old, “every year,” and then He “increased...”

- Matthew 1:17 — generations structured like a designed storyline.
- Matthew 2:1 — “during the time of King Herod...”
- Matthew 2:7 — Herod asks the Magi the exact time the star appeared.
- Matthew 2:16 — he murders based on a calculated window—two years and under.
- Matthew 2:13–15; 19–21 — “after they had gone...” and “after Herod died...”—God’s “now” and “not yet” protection.

- Luke 3:1-2 — “In the fifteenth year of Tiberius...”
- Luke 3:23 — “Now Jesus himself was about thirty years old when he began his ministry.”
- Mark 1:9-11 —“At that time Jesus came from Nazareth In Galilee and was baptized by John In the Jordan”... heaven was “torn open”..."a voice came from heaven.”

LUKE 4:3

3 The devll sald to hlm, “If you are the Son of God, tell thls stone to become bread.”

LUKE 4:5-7

5 The devil led him up to a high place and showed him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. 6 And he said to him, “I will give you all their authority and splendor; it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. 7 If you worship me, it will all be yours.”

MARK 1:15
